2. Key Centre Policies

Service Philosophy

Play

We recognise play as a biological necessity throughout childhood. Play supports children's identity, wellbeing and development, while nurturing dispositions for lifelong learning. Educators at Flagstaff Hill Kindergarten are intentional in providing spaces, materials, time and permission for children to play. We honour children's agency to ensure their engagement is meaningful, inclusive and intrinsically motivating.

Relationships

Flagstaff Hill Kindergarten is a welcoming and inclusive environment which values each child's connection with family, community, culture and place. A strengths-based approach celebrates and builds upon children's skills, knowledge and dispositions. Educators scaffold the development of children's social and emotional capabilities by being attuned and responsive to their thoughts, feelings and experiences. We 'lift up' communication to support children to learn with and from their peers. Children's relationship to nature and place is explored through our Bush Kindy program and engagement with local Aboriginal peoples. As a community, we collectively develop our knowledge of Kurna history, culture and language.

Nature & Sustainability

We create opportunities for children to explore and interact with the natural environment. Through our Bush Kindy program, children develop a sense of place through active learning in the elements. We believe nature play nurtures children's sensory systems, while strengthening their physical development, dispositions for learning, and care for Country. Our site is committed to the continued improvement of sustainability practices. We engage with Green Adelaide, enact a Sustainability Action Plan and access professional learning to support this focus.

3. Curriculum

- Bush Kindy: Runs during Term 2 and 3.
Operates onsite in our back garden and includes bush walks and exploration in Sturt Gorge (pathway access runs next to kindy).

4. Centre Based Staff

- Staff Profile:
Full time Director, 4 part time teachers and 1 part time Early Childhood Worker (educator)
- All staff members are supported through the DfE Performance Management Program at six monthly intervals
- Access to special support staff via DfE as required

5. Centre Facilities

- Buildings and grounds

Flagstaff Hill Kindergarten was established at its current location in 1975 and the building is owned by the Department for Education. It is situated in a quiet, leafy suburban street, within walking distance to the local primary school and shops. It boasts beautiful learning spaces both indoors and outdoors, including a back garden called 'Yeltanna Wirra' (meaning 'cool dry airy place') where a Bush Kindy program runs onsite.

- Capacity (per session) - 30
- Centre Ownership - DfE - Department for Education
- Access for children and staff with disabilities
 - New stairs with handrail installed in main yard in 2023, to support accessibility for all community members
 - There is no accessible toilet onsite or nappy change facilities
 - Participation in the Bush Kindy program requires a degree of physical strength and fitness

6. Local Community

- General characteristics:
- The majority of families speak English at home, however, there has been an increase in enrolments of children from varying cultural and linguistic backgrounds.
- Parent and wider community are involved in the preschool through Governing council, playgroup, fundraising and special events.
- Our main feeder schools are Flagstaff Hill R-7 School & Craighburn Primary School, with a small portion of children transitioning to nongovernment schools.

7. Further Comments

- Flagstaff Hill Kindergarten is a part of the South Valley Partnership
- The kindergarten fosters close relationships with Foundation classes at Flagstaff Hill R-7 School. This includes class visits to our site and transition conversations between teachers.
